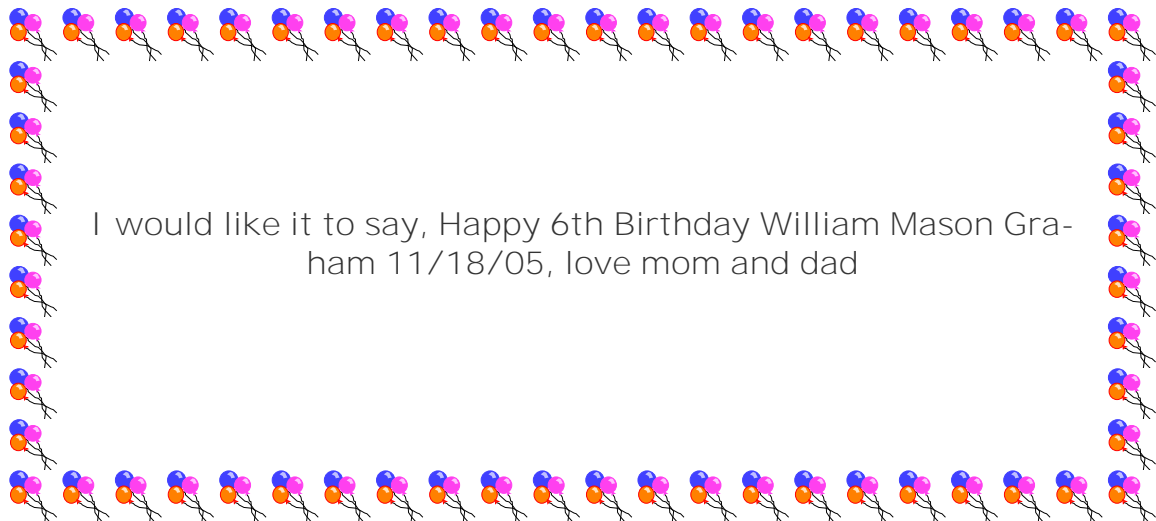

Hispaniola Hardware

C. Begnoche (a.k.a proud mama)

Wandering Whitefish Township resident, Ryan Biehl, joined the Peace Corps in August, 2009 and was assigned to the Dominican Republic, on the northeast side of the Isle of Hispaniola, a two-hour bus ride from where Columbus first landed in America. His project, designing a new water system for the community of Rio Grande al Medio, was a natural fit for someone who learned to walk barefoot and staggering on the shores of Whitefish Bay and spent hours digging, blocking, rerouting and channeling an unnamed creek (ditch) that empties into Whitefish Bay just next to his home south of Paradise.

Ryan describes Rio Grande as “A community of maybe 100 households near Altamira, Puerto Plata Province. You can find Altamira on Google maps between the cities of Santiago and Puerto Plata.”

Rio Grande al Medio and the nearby town of Altamira are a world away from Paradise yet similar in many ways. **There’s lots of water but it’s all either falling from the sky or draining here and there in impromptu streams to creeks and rivers. There are no lakes nearby and it’s upland and away from the beautiful ocean side beaches of the DR.** During winter, they get rain like Paradise gets snow. Not cold but hard to get around due to the ever present mud. At every doorstep, instead of shovels and brooms for snow, are scrapers for removing mud and mats for setting mucky brown boots on.

A familiar resource Ryan knows well; the nearest hardware store. Paradise has it's True Value, where incidentally, Ryan won the big six foot Christmas Stocking chock full of toys when he was two years old turning him into a die-hard hardware store customer. The community of Alta Mira is smaller even than Paradise; the "business district" features two small storefronts that sell beer, powdered milk, eggs and of course, lotto tickets. But the water project required lots of pipes, fittings, clasps etc to supplement the shipments of plastic pipe and cement that came in larger quantities delivered uphill by donkeys and small children. So when the project hits a snag, Ryan finds himself on a motorcycle cab speeding towards Altamira, the nearest community with a hardware store.

There, is a wall of fittings, doodads, screws, couplings and all that needful hardware stuff similar to the one Ryan first encountered in Paradise. And just like Paradise, the store is staffed by friendly, knowledgeable, resourceful people who are a great source of information, advice and directions. Another truly valuable hometown hardware store and one of many like it that Ryan haunted on his trips to assemble resources and supplies for his community's project.

As December 22, 2011 nears, the water project is complete though still in the troubleshooting phase, Ryan is getting around to other projects to advise and learn about other water systems and is in the final days of his tour of the hardware stores of the Dominican Republic and his Peace Corps service.

When he gets home to Paradise for Christmas there won't be any motorcycle cabs operating so he'll have to hail a pickup truck with a plough for his ride to the hardware store.

2: Run fruit through grinder. Use the entire (seedless) orange, peels, pith and all.

3: Mix in the sugar. Let sit at room temperature until sugar dissolves, about 45 minutes. Store in the refrigerator. Use as an alternative to regular cranberry sauce and also good on turkey sandwiches.

Brandied Cranberries Recipe –makes about 2 cups

1 (12-ounce) bag of fresh or frozen cranberries

1 1/2 cups sugar

1/3 to 1/2 cup brandy

2 Tbsp finely shredded orange zest (use microplane zester)

1: Preheat oven to 325°F. Sort through cranberries and discard any that are soft or decayed.

2: Mix cranberries, sugar, brandy, and orange zest in a 8 or 9-inch square baking dish. Bake uncovered until most of the liquid has evaporated, 1 to 1 1/4 hours, stirring occasionally. Chill up to one week.

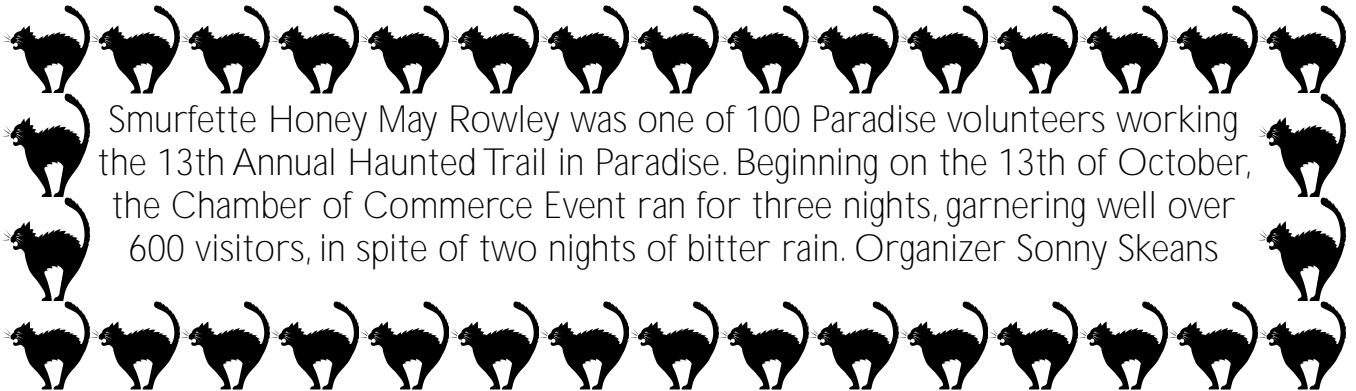

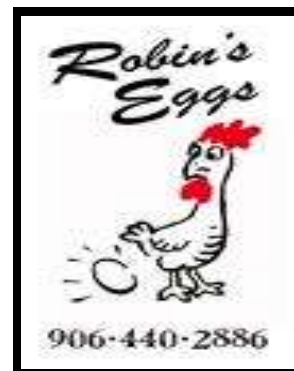
The advance predictions are for a white November. Is your snow blower ready?

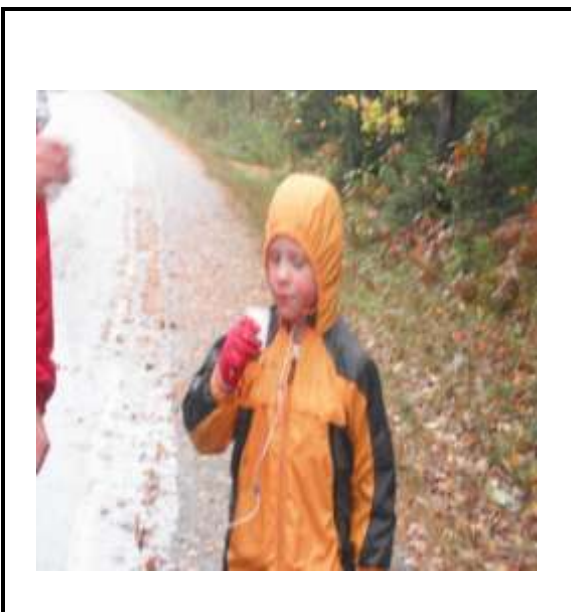

President Al Dean suggested that the Seniors might put on a dinner

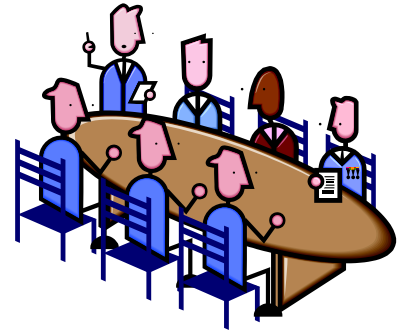
